2017. The election results appear elsewhere in this newsletter.



NATIONAL PARK SERVICE CENTENNIAL

In honor of the National Park Service's 100th anniversary, on August 25, 2016, I visited Yellowstone National Park, the first National Park created in America. Named for the Yellowstone River, it encompasses 3,500 square miles in Wyoming. Old Faithful is the most well-known thermal feature; it erupts seventeen times daily with heights ranging from 106 to 184 feet, and lasts between one-and-a-half to five minutes. Half of the world's geysers are in the Park.

I also visited the adjacent 485 square mile Grand Teton National Park which lies to the south. The mountains are magnificent, ranging in height



from 6,320 to 13,770 feet. The National Museum of Wildlife Art, including a sculpture hiking path, is conveniently located along the highway outside of Jackson Hole. A \$10 senior lifetime pass can be used at all National Parks, and it admits you and three others in your car.

On September 29, a small group of hardy ACRA members and a guest took a soggy tour of the Pittsburgh Botanic Garden (PBG) led by ACRA member and PBG volunteer Lynn Heckman. Since our spring walk at the Wildflower Preserve in Raccoon State Park was also on a rainy day, we were prepared for a wet commune with nature.

Each time we visit PBG we see the progress that is being made in this wonderful county asset. This time we saw the beautiful expanded flower display in the Bob and Joan Pierce Garden; the apiary supporting a bee





population in the big dogwood meadow and the restored log cabin near the Heritage Apple Orchard where the eight Barred Rock chickens are now producing eggs. There are more plantings at the Asian Garden along the lake, and stepping stones are now placed across the shallow end of the water. Wooden duck boxes have been installed near the lake. We walked a trail to the Bookworm Glen and came to a charming hermit hut with a table, chair, and books inside. In addition to the natural beauty of the garden, sculptures created by Pittsburgh artists are in place throughout and will remain there until January.

After our tour, we headed to the Oakdale Diner to dry out and enjoy a delicious lunch.
