DUQUESNE BREWERY CLOCK

The following article is the fourth in a series of articles where we will be detailing some fascinating and interesting history of our great County. We hope you enjoy.



The Pittsburgh landmark Duquesne Brewery clock is not only the largest single-clock face in the United States but the thirdlargest clock face in the world!

It measures 60 by 60 feet, with a laminated aluminum 35-foot minute hand and a 25-foot hour hand. You would expect the gears and innards of the clock would be huge to operate the clock, when in fact the entire motor and housing case of the clock's mechanism is only approximately 4 feet by 4 feet. It only requires 1 1/4 horsepower to run. The clock is nearly twice the size of London's Big Ben and was built in Georgia by Audichron for \$12,500 and shipped to Pittsburgh.

Originally the clock was located on a Mount Washington hillside, the clock's face was used as advertising for a string of beverages, including Coca-Cola, Fort Pitt, Ballantine, Carling, and Schlitz beers. In 1961, the Duquesne Brewing Company bought the clock and moved it to the top of its plant at the corner of South 21st and Mary Streets as a publicity stunt and had its slogan "Have a Duke" painted on the face. After the brewery closed in 1972, the clock was leased to Stroh's Beer, then WTAE-TV. John Cigna once even hung on it for a KDKA radio commercial. In 1983 the clock was prominently displayed in the popular movie, Flashdance. After WTAE's lease ended in 1993, the clock was in need of repairs for several years, when in 1999 the Pittsburgh Brewing Company paid \$44,000 to repair the clock and paid \$5,000 a month to show its logo on the face. In 2002, Equitable Gas paid to have their name placed on the clock. In October 2009, AT&T took over the rights to advertise on the clock. As of 2017 there has been no advertising displayed on its face.

Carrier Alert is a lifeline for those living alone provided by the US Postal Service. It was developed especially for older adults, the homebound and the disabled to help them reach vital services in case of an accident or sudden illness. In Allegheny County, the Area Agency on Aging notifies the local post office of customers who wish to participate in the program. In performing daily rounds, the customer's letter carrier will alert the agency to an accumulation of mail that might signify reason for concern. DHS/AA then follows up.

STRAWBERRY SPINACH/BIBB LETTUCE SALAD

1 medium head Bibb lettuce 1 bag baby spinach 1/2 red onion slice thinly 3-4 oz. slivered almonds 1-pint strawberries sliced

Dressing: Mix together

1/4 cup red wine vinegar 1/2 cup vegetable oil 1/2 tsp. almond extract 1/4 cup sugar 1 tsp. salt 1 tsp. pepper

Prepare the almonds: 1/8 cup sugar 1/4 cup melted butter

Add the almonds and sauté lightly until lightly brown and sugar begins to caramelize

Lay on a paper towel to separate and cool

Combine the salad, almonds, and dressing to serve.



CDC GUIDELINES ON WHAT YOU CAN DO ONCE YOU HAVE BEEN FULLY VACCINATED FOR COVID-19*

- 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or
- 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine

YOU CAN:

- Visit inside a home or private setting without a mask with other fully vaccinated people of any age.
- Visit inside a home or private setting without a mask with one household of unvaccinated people who are not at risk for severe illness.
- Travel domestically without a pre-or post-travel test.
- Travel domestically without guarantining after travel.
- Travel internationally without a pre-travel test depending on destination.
- Travel internationally without quarantining after travel.

YOU SHOULDN'T:

- Visit indoors without a mask, with people at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19.
- Attend medium or large gatherings.
