HOLIDAY MEMORIES OF DR. HOON AND JENKINS ARCADE

My dislike of my optometrist, Dr. Hoon, was nothing personal --other than the fact that I held him single-handedly responsible for my being the only person in my first-grade class to wear eyeglasses. In my inexperienced mind, those blue spectacles, complete with a clip-on eye patch, rendered me a freak of nature, and it was all Dr. Hoon's fault. But my parents firmly believed in him, and I had no real choice in the matter.

Putting all childhood trauma aside, there was an unexpected upside to this. Dr. Hoon's office was in the Jenkin's Arcade, the most exquisite building I had ever seen in my entire six years on this planet. And it just so happened that my appointment was scheduled during the holiday season. For that reason, my eye exam became incorporated into my family's annual sojourn into the big city. With all the sparkling lights and ornaments, in my mind it was the most magnificent building known to all humanity.

Mom, sensing how distraught I was over the whole eyeglass ordeal, decided that she and I would explore the Jenkins Arcade alone, without any of the other family members. My dad apparently had agreed to keep tabs on my baby sister, Laurel, while Mike and Kevin, ages 8 and

10, were deemed mature enough to set out on their own to explore this marvelous bastion of opulence. But, more importantly for me, I finally had my mom all to myself!

Mom and I were able to experience three floors of retail bliss. This included getting our feet measured without buying any shoes and spraying ourselves with fancy perfume. After that it was over to the Parker Button Store where we bonded over our shared love of sewing notions. Finally, we took an elevator that was operated by a man seated on a stool. With one push of a button, he took us up to the second floor where we were able to look over the edge and spy on people in the pedestrian walkway below. All of this was followed by a giant ice cream cone. To me, Jenkins Arcade was a glorious city, all within one building.

It's still a shame to me that the Jenkins Arcade is no longer part of the Pittsburgh community of exquisite buildings. Built in 1911, it was first made a landmark in 1972 only to be savagely demolished twelve years later. The building is gone, but aside from Dr. Hoon and those little blue glasses, it remains a fond memory of my childhood and the family that made annual holiday excursions to the Jenkins Arcade.



RICHARD KEVIN BRYANT:

“Kip” to Family, Friends & Fellow Retirees

Richard Kevin Bryant, affectionately known as “Kip” to family, friends and fellow retirees since his uncle tagged him with the nickname in childhood, retired in 2023 after serving two separate stints totaling 36 years in Allegheny County government.

Kip initially worked as a Probation Officer in Juvenile Court from 1984 to 1991. He left briefly but returned when Juvenile Court launched a new school-based probation program and re-hired him as a Probation Officer assigned to Peabody High School in 1994.

After nearly two years in the school-based probation program, Kip was transferred to the Office of the Allegheny County Commissioners and worked as an assistant to newly elected County Commissioner Bob Cranmer.

Upon completion of Cranmer’s term in 2000, Kip moved to the Department of Human Services (DHS) and worked in various programs, including planning, youth employment/training, and contract compliance, where he served the longest, from 2012 until his retirement.

During his early days in DHS, Kip had the pleasure of meeting and working with a newcomer to the region who was committed

to bringing training and employment opportunities to disadvantaged youth. That newcomer was John Fetterman, before he became Mayor of Braddock, Lieutenant Governor of Pennsylvania and ultimately a United States Senator.

Kip grew up on Pittsburgh’s North Side and went to public and parochial schools before attending Perry High School and graduating in 1975. He played football and to this day continues his association with Perry as an assistant football coach for the past 40 years.

A 1980 graduate of Indiana University of Pennsylvania, Kip earned a bachelor’s degree in criminology, played football and participated in Reserve Officers’ Training Corps (ROTC).

After graduation, Kip entered the U.S. Army as a 2nd Lieutenant at Fort Benning, Georgia. He served three years and completed both Army Ranger School and Army Airborne School, earning his wings and becoming a qualified paratrooper in the 82nd Airborne Division. His military service continued in the U.S. Army Reserve until 1991.

In addition to coaching football at Perry, Kip’s community service extends to the Edgewood Recreation Board’s summer

softball program for young boys and girls. He started managing the program when his daughters played and still does so 28 years later. He also served as PTO President during his daughters’ intermediate school years at Woodland Hills.

A longtime resident of Regent Square, Kip is the proud father of two daughters, Ginger and Melody, and has two beloved grandchildren, Abram and Noah. The birth of a third grandchild, his first granddaughter, is expected in January.
